

Featured Guest Artist - Elena Mukhina Rumyantseva



Eleana is a mixed media artist that will join us to share her techniques to create colorful postcard sized collages.

Elena Mukhina Rumyantseva was born 1975 in Moscow, Russia in a family of an Engineer and an Artist parents. Her passion for drawing as a child led her to pursue art for higher education. At the age of 15 she completed 3 years of art school. In 1996, she began teaching art to kids. In 1998 she graduated with a Fine Art Criticism degree from Glazunov Academy of Art.

Elena relocated to the United States in 2013 with her husband and 3 kids where she continued her career as an art teacher in Russian community in San Jose, CA. While tending to her family and teaching, she has continued and still continuing her studies and self-realization as an artist in the area of painting and decorative arts.

Elena has developed a technique to decorate wine bottles and framed cards. While continuing to discover her own style, she creates amazing art with all forms of 2d art mediums. One of the most intriguing works of her is the creation of stunning landscapes using collage of carefully cut and shaped leather pieces.

January 2020 - Featured Artist Nancy Duesing Takaichi






Thank you so much to Nancy for participating at our January meeting and providing a great demonstration of Plein air painting! It was very informative and valuable.

The EVA members who attended had great questions, and it was an enjoyable and interactive session.

Nancy's tips:

- Find a bag that will easily hold all your supplies.
- Having an easel with a tripod is great for uneven surfaces.
- Use velcro for lids and such, so you don't lose them.
- Keep your projects small; distill the subject to find the story.
- Don't try to capture all of the scenery in one painting.
- Take photos for reference of shadows as they will change throughout the day; you are trying to capture more than the single moment a photo would provide.
- Set up in the morning as the shadows are better in the afternoon and find a shady spot.
- Keep in mind, our eyes will adjust to the shadows as the day progresses.
- Try and stay organized to save time in set-up and tear down.
- Bring water, sunscreen, and a good hat.



January Meeting Highlights

We had a great meeting to kick-off the new year and decade. 20+ members attended to learn more about Plein air painting, and a number of folks participated in the challenge. Thank you to everyone that participated and attended!







Glenna has been creating artwork for over 25 years now. She started by taking a stained glass course at a local glass shop in San Jose, after moving from Canada; knowing very little about glass, and even less about soldering! Within a few weeks, she was consumed with work on glass projects both small and large. After going to some glass conferences in Las Vegas, and taking classes, she expanded into glass fusing, glass painting, mosaics and more. The ability to create and form drove her to try new techniques and she experimented for several years.



After moving to Hawaii, she found new inspiration in the ocean and started to pull color and texture from her natural surroundings. Her work with hot glass also now included beads, created using oxygen/propane torches. She also started to work more with jewelry items, and learned how to work with silver to build her own settings. She created hard-soldered silver items with dichroic fused glass, and more.

Since moving back to San Jose, she has expanded her workspace into a large open-space warehouse, which finally gives her enough space to run multiple projects at the same time.

A large showroom also allows display of some of the more interesting items! This also has allowed her to run some small classes (with minimal fees) on glass casting and paint projects. Her most recent interests include Cremains (fusing ash remains into glass items as a rememberance), alcohol inks, glass weaving, and even crochet items!
